NOTE: PAWS only euthanizes animals who have untreatable illnesses/injuries, or whose behavior would make them a danger to the public if released. In 2022, 33% (23 of 70) of animals euthanized were ailing, suffering kittens with grave prognosis. Thirty-seven (37) adult cats and seven (7) adult dogs were euthanized because they were suffering from untreatable illnesses or injuries. Three (3) adult dogs were euthanized due to untreatable, aggressive behavior. Among animals who died, 63% (20 of 32) were kittens who succumbed to untreatable illness. Six (6) adult cats and two (2) adult dogs died due to untreatable illness, one (1) puppy died due to failure to thrive. Two (2) cats died due to surgical complication, and one (1) was involved in an accident. The three (3) cats listed as "Lost in Care" escaped from their foster/adopter's care and were not found despite extensive searches.
