

Over 50% of recent adopters who reach out seeking help with their newly adopted pet are having trouble with single kitten behaviors, so we always suggest kittens go home in pairs or to a home with another young, playful cat. We are NOT trying to push more kittens out the door, but rather set you and your new pet up for success! We want to prepare you for behaviors you will almost certainly see and only have the kitten's best interest at heart, as well as your satisfaction as a pet parent.

I am aware that a single kitten often develops the below behaviors. I have been counseled about the consequences of adopting a single kitten. I am prepared to compensate for lack of species- appropriate interaction, and can be patient while my infant kitten grows into a mature adult.

Biting

□ Attacking

Destructiveness

• Keeping humans up at night

- Scratching
- Generalized anxiety
- Excessive meowing
- □ Inappropriate elimination (peeing/pooping around the house)
